

The Physics Department at Mount Allison University invites applications for a one-year McCain Post-Doctoral (teaching) fellowship position commencing July 1, 2023, subject to budgetary approval. The successful candidate will have recently completed a Ph.D. in Physics or related field. The candidate will be required to teach three courses, and possible classes will depend on the candidate's field of expertise. The candidate will also have an opportunity to participate in undergraduate student research supervision/mentorship. Current areas of research specialization in the Physics Department include theoretical particle physics; medical physics; experimental subatomic physics; stellar astrophysics; and materials science.

A complete application will include a letter of application, curriculum vitae, statements of teaching and research interests. When available, submission of evidence of effective and inclusive teaching is encouraged.
